Burnet held the offices of President, Vice-President and Secretary of State in the government of the Republic of Texas. Prior to his arrival in Texas, Burnet had an adventuresome career as a volunteer in the Miranda expedition to free Venezuela from Spain, tried and failed to establish a Louisiana trading post, and lived among the Comanche Indians for two years.

Papers include personal and family correspondence, land tax receipts, private notebooks, and military, business and political records.

The William Este Burnet letter included in this accession have been published: The Removal of the Texas Indians and the Founding of Fort Cobb, by Raymond Estep, Oklohoma Historical Society, 1961.
