Henry Toebelman, 1837-1923, a native of Bremen, Germany, landed at New Orleans in 1854. He was employed briefly as a clerk on a Morgan Line steamship operating between New Orleans and Galveston, and settled in the Texas city later that year.

Enlisting in the Confederate army at the outbreak of the Civil War, Toebelman became a leader of Cook's Heavy Artillery Band. In 1866 he married Elizabeth Jersig who was born in Austria and came to Galveston in 1845 at the age of ten.

Following the war, he was employed by F. Halff and Company, later Halff, Weis and Company, as a bookkeeper. In the early 1870's, Toebelman established a wholesale shoe leather and findings company which carried the family name. In 1885 he started the Galveston Steam Shoe Factory which he operated until the 1900 storm.

Papers are letters from friends and family members, the earliest of which are in German; business correspondence; receipts from Toebelman and Company; and miscellaneous papers including deeds, estate papers, a land grant, a will, and bank statements.
