Anne Ammons Brindley  
& Walter E. Grover Papers,  
1884-1986; 3 feet, 1 1/2 inches

A journalism graduate of the Baylor College for Women, Mrs. Brindley was involved in the reactivation of the Galveston Historical Foundation, serving as its first president, 1954-1958. She was active in the opening of the Williams-Tucker house, 3601 Avenue P, to the public. In 1973, she was selected to serve as president of the Texas State Historical Association, only the second woman to do so.

Mrs. Brindley published an article on Jane Long in the October 1952 edition of the Southwestern Historical Quarterly. She was also active in the health field, serving as president of the Galveston County Medical Society Woman's Auxiliary and vice-president of the Texas Medical Association's Auxiliary. Her community involvement including service as president of the Friends of the Rosenberg Library and as president of the Young Women's Christian Association.

Her husband, Paul Brindley, served as the head of the department of pathology at the University of Texas Medical Branch from 1929 until his death in 1954.

Walter E. Grover (1869-1960) was the son of George Washington Grover, veteran of the Texas Santa Fe Expedition of 1841. Walter Grover was first employed in the law office of Robert G. Street. He retired in 1950 after serving fifty-five years with the firm of H. M. Trueheart & Company, which became John Adriance & Son in 1905. Grover served two terms as president of the Galveston Historical Society. His papers, which include correspondence and subject files on Galveston forts, early settlers, and other topics, reflect his avid interest in local history.

These papers have been arranged to the series level with the exception of the correspondence, which has been arranged to the item level.

A map of Galveston, January 1904, has been transferred to Maps (see #466A), and a copy of the 1942 edition of Texas Voters Handbook has been added to the GTHC's book collection. Two 70th anniversary ribbons, 1889-1959, for Rosenberg School have been



transferred to the Museum. Reference should also be made to Special Collection #119, which contains photographs, snapshots, negatives, and postcards separated from these papers.
